

In-Kind Donations for Central City Concern

Central City Concern is a 501c3 nonprofit agency serving single adults and families in the Portland metro area who are impacted by homelessness, poverty, mental illness, and addictions. Founded in 1979, the agency's services include a range of affordable housing options integrated with healthcare, addiction recovery support, and employment services.

Many of the people who turn to us for help arrive with very few, if any, personal possessions. Here is what one resident said upon receiving a basket of basic household items when she entered CCC housing:

In-kind Needs

- Hygiene kits (soap, razors, shaving cream, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, comb, brush, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, washcloths, and feminine hygiene products).
- SOCKS!!!
- Basic kitchen items: specifically pots, pans, cutlery, dishes, and can openers.
- Bed linens, blankets, and pillows.
- Men's and women's seasonally appropriate clothing, including coats, shoes, mittens, scarves, and hats.
- Office appropriate clothing for men and women for interviews and new jobs.
- Baby and toddler clothing, diapers, baby wipes, blankets, car seats (new), strollers, and maternity clothes.
- Holiday gifts and gift cards for children living in our alcohol- and drug-free family housing. Please contact
