As part of our policy and commitment to a drug and alcohol-free workplace we conduct post-offer, pre-employment drug screens.

TITLE: Nursing Care Provider II On-Call
DEPARTMENT: Hooper Subacute Detoxification Program

SALARY: \$27.00 per hour - Differential for evenings, nights, weekends
SHIFT: On-Call

On Call employees must work at least once in every 6 month period to remain active on payroll.

SUMMARY: This position provides direct client care for a medically monitored 24 hour 7 day a week 54 + bed detoxification and stabilization center. Has the support of Medical Director and Nursing Manager.

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:

1. Provide direct care and delegate care of patients as indicated by client needs.
2. Triage and assess clients desiring admission to the detoxification program.
3. Administer medications and treatments as directed by the standing orders.
4. Observe and record pertinent information with regard to the care and condition of patients.
5. Formulate individualized nursing care plans and participate in patient care conferences.
6. Make referrals to hospitals and other agencies.
7. Provide clinical/medical direction for Subacute Technicians.
8. Assist the staff physician.
9. Give and receive report at shift changes.
10. Provide admission for referred clients per Nursing Manager and/or Medical Director.
11. Maintain client roster with updates for each shift.
12. Review charts.
13. Perform other duties as assigned.

SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

1. Knowledge of nursing theory and practice.
2. Knowledge of chemical dependency and treatment methods.
3. Application of knowledge in nutrition, sanitation, and personal hygiene.
4. Ability to follow oral and written directions and to apply techniques for specific needs.
5. Knowledge of community resources.

8. Knowledge of de-escalation methods or ability to be trained in de-escalation methods.
9. Physical ability to move and restrain clients in an emergency situation.
10. Sufficient manual dexterity and physical ability to perform assigned tasks.
11. Ability to successfully interact with a wide variety of people including the clients, the manager and co-workers.
12. Ability to work in an environment where people may be hostile or abusive.
13. Ability to manage time and meet deadlines.
14. Ability to lift and move heavy objects.
15. Ability to maintain accurate records and necessary paperwork.
16. Ability to learn and apply training instruction.
17. Knowledge of medical assessment with intoxicated persons.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Completion of an accredited two, three or four year course of training for nurses.
2. Current Oregon RN license.
3. Current CPR certification or must obtain within one month if not current.
4. If a recovering chemically dependent person must be in a program of recovery and able to provide documentation of sobriety a minimum of two years.
5. Must have the physical ability to bend, stoop, twist, kneel, reach, squat, pull and lift heavy clients or objects.
6. Must be able to climb stairs several times a day.
7. Must be able to document nursing interventions and responses to care. Do so in an accurate, legible, and intelligible manner.
8. Must pass a pre-employment drug screen and background check.
9. Must adhere to agency's non-discrimination policies.
10. Ability to effectively interact with co-workers and clients with diverse ethnic backgrounds, religious views, political affiliation, cultural backgrounds, life-styles, and sexual orientations and treat each individual with respect and dignity.
