Central City Concern's (CCC) Blackburn Center will give vulnerable people access to integrated housing, employment and health services, and provide support they need to stabilize and rebuild their lives.

Our goal is to improve the quality of life of Portland's homeless and very low-income community members, and reduce use of the crisis system by providing innovative, comprehensive services focused on their whole well-being. We will do this by delivering an integrated model out of a single building with multi-disciplinary teams centered on our different populations.

Our guiding principles will drive this work to be:

- person centered
- trauma informed
- integrated and in collaboration with community partners
- focused on diversity, equity and inclusion, and
- sustainable for long-term success.

CCC is already known for much of this work, and now we move toward a first-of-its-kind operating model (including key changes such as centralized intake and integrate care teams) in a more diverse community and a landscape of new potential community partners. About 40 percent of East Portland's population are from communities of color. We will be a true reflection of the community and design our services and teams to achieve a culturally responsive place for our clients.
